iTheatrics began in 2006 when fearless leader Timothy Allen McDonald (Founder and CEO) put together a core team, including Vice President of Publications Steven G. Kennedy, Director of Mainstage Programming Marty Johnson, Senior Education Consultant Cindy Ripley, and Senior Vice President of Publications Susan Fuller. These amazing folks, through hard work, an unwavering commitment to theatre education for young people, and a deep dedication to all things jazz hands, brought Broadway Junior® into the world.

Soon enough, the fabulous Lindsay Weiner Lupi joined the team as Vice President of Education and took on the (now colossal) task of JTF Administrator; then, the team gained Copyist and Composer Rob Rokicki (ever heard of The Lightning Thief: The Percy Jackson Musical? Rob wrote that!). Creative Media Director and Publications Editor Laura Jo Schuster arrived next to help make sure every Broadway Junior ShowKit® is picture perfect. Music Associate and Ratatouille: The TikTok Musical composer Daniel J. Mertzlufft arrived in 2015 and brought a little sparkle to the team, and in 2016 Program Director, DEI Advisor, and Jill-of-alltrades powerhouse Jiana J. Odland hopped on board. Mary-Catherine **Chambliss** has joined the team as Education Director after many years of collaborating as a teaching artist.



Last but not least, former JTF kid **Alex Robertson** came onboard in 2021 as Producing Associate.

Since 2006, iTheatrics has been bringing musical theatre to young people everywhere. In a typical year, over 36 million people sit in the audience of one of our adaptations - three times the number of people who see a Broadway show each year. iTheatrics is committed to creating quality musical theatre programs for young people through our partnership with the Shubert Foundation/MTI Broadway Junior Middle School Musical Theater Program, which has built hundreds of musical theater programs in New York City Schools. We partnered with the President's Committee on the Arts and Humanities and facilitated programs for Turnaround Arts, which used the arts to build successful schools. With former First Lady Michelle Obama, we presented in the first-ever White House Talent Show.

The Educational Theatre Foundation (ETF), in collaboration with iTheatrics and Music Theatre International (MTI), created JumpStart Theatre (JST), a three-year scalable program designed to create sustainable

theatre arts programs in under-served middle schools where there were none. These programs are active in Cincinnati, St. Louis, San Diego, Atlanta, Frostburg, and Detroit.

iTheatrics celebrates musical theatre education programs through our Junior Theater Celebrations held in New York City, the Blumenthal Center for the Performing Arts in Charlotte, North Carolina, and Shea's Performing Arts Center in Buffalo, New York.

The Junior Theater Festivals are the world's biggest and best festivals exclusively dedicated to to musical theatre education. These festivals are held in Atlanta, Sacramento, and also internationally in the United Kingdom, Australia, and New Zealand.

iTheatrics works hard to make the world a better place, one musical at a time. We are committed to making sure every kid has the life-changing opportunity to make a musical. So, what are you waiting for? Rock those wristbands, warm up your voices, mask up, and get ready for even more musical theater magic. Welcome back to the Junior Theater Festival.



STEPHANIE J. BLOCK

Stephanie has established herself as one of the most relevant and versatile voices in contemporary musical theatre. She most recently won the 2019 Tony Award for Best Leading Actress in a Musical, as well as winning The Drama Desk Award and Outer Critics Award for her STAR turn in THE CHER SHOW. Ms. Block was also recognized for her role of Trina in Lincoln Center Theatre's 2016 revival of FALSETTOS garnering her the Tony Award, Drama Desk and Outer Critics nominations for Best Featured Actress in a Musical. In 2013 she was recognized with both the Drama Desk and TONY Award nomination(s) for Best Leading Actress in a Musical for her portrayal of Alice Nutting/Edwin DROOD in The Roundabout Theater's production of THE MYSTERY OF EDWIN DROOD. That marks 3 TONY Award nominations in the last 6 years, a feat very few Broadway actors have attained. Other Broadway credits include Reno Sweeney in the

2011 TONY Award winning revival of ANYTHING GOES, 9 TO 5: THE MUSICAL playing the role of Judy Bernly for which she earned a Drama Desk nomination for Best Actress in a Musical. She created the roles of Grace O'Malley in THE PIRATE QUEEN and Liza Minnelli In THE BOY FROM OZ (opposite Hugh Jackman). Ms. Block is best known for her portrayal as Elphaba in the Broadway company of WICKED as well as originating the role in the First National Tour for which she won numerous awards including the prestigious Helen Hayes Award for Outstanding Actress in a Musical.

Ms. Block has sung with numerous symphony orchestras including the NY Pops at Carnegie Hall, Boston Pops, National Symphony Orchestra (under the baton of Marvin Hamlisch), Dallas Symphony, Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, Utah Symphony, Columbus Symphony, Charlotte Symphony and the Cleveland Pops among many others. Her solo concert has been critically acclaimed and continues to sell out throughout the US and in London.

Some of her Off-Broadway and regional theatrical credits include LITTLE MISS SUNSHINE (Drama Desk nomination for Outstanding Featured Actress in a Musical), BY THE WAY, MEET VERA STARK (Drama Desk nomination for Outstanding Featured Actress in a Play), THEY'RE PLAYING OUR SONG (starring opposite Jason Alexander), CATS (St Louis' Kevin Kline Award Nominee- Best Actress), FUNNY GIRL, CRAZY FOR YOU (L.A. Ovation Award Nominee), OLIVER (Critics Award-Best Actress), James Joyce's THE DEAD, TRIUMPH OF LOVE, THE GRASS HARP, SOUTH PACIFIC, WILL ROGERS FOLLIES and the World Premiere of WICKED.

Stephanie's solo album, THIS PLACE I KNOW has been received with great praise, lauded by critics as "One of the best debut recordings to come out of the Broadway community in quite some time... 6 out of 5 stars". An array of award-winning songwriters assembled to help interpret their music on Stephanie's album. Composers such as Stephen Schwartz, Marvin Hamlisch and the legendary Dolly Parton join forces with Ms. Block to create a thrilling musical experience. Stephanie's voice can be heard on multiple cast recordings, including THE BOY FROM OZ, THE PIRATE QUEEN, WICKED's 5th Anniversary Album and 9 TO 5: THE MUSICAL (Grammy Nomination).

Television credits include: BLUFF CITY LAW (NBC), RISE (upcoming: NBC), MADAME SECRETARY (CBS), ORANGE IS THE NEW BLACK (Netflix), HOMELAND (Showtime), IT COULD BE WORSE (HULU).

SEBASTIAN ARCELUS

Sebastian Arcelus was most recently seen as 'Jay Whitman' on the long-running CBS hit series MADAM SECRETARY opposite Téa Leoni. Arcelus is also known for his memorable role as 'Lucas Goodwin' on the critically acclaimed Netflix original series HOUSE OF CARDS and recently starred in a recurring role on the second season of HBO's THE DEUCE, created by David Simon and George Pelecanos. Additional television credits include

stints on HBO's THE LEFTOVERS and on FBI and PERSON OF INTEREST for CBS. On the big screen, Arcelus was most recently seen in the M. Night Shyamalan feature SPLIT with James McAvoy. He was featured in the Universal Pictures hit TED 2 opposite Mark Wahlberg and directed by Seth MacFarlane. He also starred in THE BEST OF ME (Relativity) opposite Michelle Monaghan and the independent feature THE LAST DAY OF AUGUST, for which he also served as co-producer.

On stage, Arcelus most recently starred on Broadway in the stage adaptation of John Grisham's A TIME TO KILL. His additional Broadway credits include ELF, JERSEY BOYS, WICKED, RENT, and GOOD VIBRATIONS. Off-Broadway credits include HAPPINESS (Lincoln Center Theater), THE BLUE FLOWER (Second Stage), and WHERE'S CHARLEY? (Encores! at City Center). He has also appeared in numerous regional and international productions, including the world premiere of William Finn's SONGS OF INNOCENCE AND EXPERIENCE. His voice has also been heard over the years on many television commercials and animated programs.



ANDREW RESNICK

Andrew Resnick is a New York based music director, conductor, pianist, and composer. He was most recently the music director for *The Cher Show* at the Neil Simon Theatre. He was the conductor for Lincoln Center Theatre's *The King and I* and the conductor/pianist for the Second Stage Theatre revival of *The Last Five Years*. Broadway credits include conducting *Mean Girls*, *War Paint*, *The Bridges of Madison County*, *Peter and the Starcatcher*, and playing keyboards for *The Book of Mormon*, and *Wicked*.

He was the associate music director to Gustavo Dudamel for the Los Angeles Philharmonic production of *Sondheim on Sondheim* at the Hollywood Bowl and is currently working with San Francisco Music Director Laureate Michael Tilson Thomas on a program of the conductor's songs. He music directed, conducted, and contributed arrangements to the 5th Avenue Theatre production of *Bliss*. Other piano/conducting credits *Far From Heaven* (Playwrights Horizons), *A Civil War Christmas* (NYTW) and *Sycamore Trees* (Signature Theatre). He has music directed concerts for Jonathan Groff, Kelli O'Hara, and Betsy Wolfe and often serves as Patti Lupone's pianist. He is currently composing a musical adaptation of Lois Lowry's *The Giver* for producer Marc Platt. Andrew is a graduate of Yale University.

2022 Junior Theater Festival **iTheatrics**



Timothy Allen McDonald

Founder and Executive Producer
Tim is the Founder and Producer of Junior
Theater Festivals Worldwide, serving over
15,000 musical theatre makers annually,
and the Founder and CEO of iTheatrics. Tim

has adapted over 125 musicals for the education market, ranging from *Xanadu JR*. to *Annie JR*. An estimated 36 million people attend one of these productions annually, which prior to the pandemic, was three times the number of people who attend a show on Broadway each year.

In 1997, Tim moved to New York City from Northern California to become a musical theatre librettist. Credits include Roald Dahl's James and the Giant Peach (Pasek and Paul), Roald Dahl's Willy Wonka (Leslie Bricusse and Anthony Newley), and The Big One-Oh! (Doug Besterman, Dean Pitchford), which was reimagined as the world's first "Zoomsical" and one of the most produced musicals during the 2020-2021 pandemic. In addition, McDonald penned Hans Christian Andersen (Frank Loesser), which opened at Nashville Children's Theater February 20, 2020; Between The Lines (Samsel and Anderson) which will open Off-Broadway in June of 2022, The Book Thief (Samsel and Anderson), opening in the U.K. fall 2022, and Breathe written with Jodi Picoult and five songwriting teams (Rob Rokicki and Rebecca Murillo, Daniel J. Mertzlufft and Kate Leonard, Doug Besterman and Sharon Vaughn, Douglas Lyons and Ethan Pakchar, Marcy Heisler and Zina Goldrich) which has been inducted into the Library of Congress. The cast album is available from Broadway Records featuring a star-studded cast including Broadway royalty Brian Stokes Mitchell and Kelli O'Hara. In December of 2021 Tim opened Jim Henson's Emmet Otter's Jug-Band Christmas at the New Victory Theatre in the Broadway Box. The New York Times hailed the show as "superb," "heart-whole beautiful," and a "message that celebrates fellow feeling and mutual care"... which "is especially welcome right now."

Tim is the co-author of *The iTheatrics Method: The Quintessential Guide to Creating Quality Musical Theatre Programs*, the world's first-ever educational musical theatre textbook (GIA Publications, Inc.), which is available everywhere books are sold. Tim dedicates this festival to our teachers, who continue to make the world a better place one musical at a time, despite the odds.



Susan Fuller

Director of Production
Susan's theatre career began in the third
grade when she starred as the title
character in Miss Louisa and The Outlaws. It
wasn't until her sophomore year of high

school when her drama teacher made her the stage manager of the spring musical that she realized (for her) backstage is where the theatre magic really happens. Susan is an Equity Stage Manager with a BFA in Theatre Design and Production from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music. Her involvement with Broadway Junior® started in 2001 when she served as Production Stage Manager for the pilot of Les Misérables School Edition. Susan has been a part of iTheatrics from day one (although how many summers that includes is the topic of some debate), where she is the Senior Managing Editor, overseeing the publication process for all materials released by iTheatrics, from adapted titles to study guides and educational materials currently circulating in classrooms worldwide. She is married to a ridiculous man who thinks she's hysterically funny and the mom of two school-aged gingers, Beckett and Gus.



Lindsay Weiner Lupi

Director of Festival Administration Lindsay (she/her) was part of the first generation of young people to experience the transformative power of the arts through Broadway Junior®. She made her theatrical

debut as a seven-year-old with no front teeth, playing the role of Molly in Annie. Subsequently, she played the role of Golde in Fiddler on the Roof JR. and then continued her work with Broadway Junior® as the Music Director of multiple pilot productions at North Shore Music Theatre. It was there she met Marty Johnson, which led her to join the iTheatrics team after receiving her BFA in drama from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts. At iTheatrics, Lindsay serves as the Vice President of Education and as the Music Supervisor, where she has music directed, musically adapted, and/or helped creatively shape over 90 adaptations for Music Theatre International, Disney Theatricals, Tams-Witmark, The Rodgers and Hammerstein Organization, and Samuel French. Additional music directing credits include the Disney+ series Encore!, NYMF, multiple national tours, and The Sign of the Seahorse and The Musical Adventures of Flat Stanley JR. for the Millennium Stage at the Kennedy Center.
