Last but not least, former JTF kid **Rebecca Marlowe** came on board in 2022 as Education Associate.

Since 2006, iTheatrics has been bringing musical theatre to young people everywhere. In a typical year, over 36 million people sit in the audience of one of our adaptations - three times the number of people who see a Broadway show each year. iTheatrics is committed to creating quality musical theatre programs for young people through our partnership with the Shubert Foundation/MTI Broadway Junior Middle School Musical Theater Program, which has built hundreds of musical theater programs in New York City schools. We partnered with the President's Committee on the Arts and Humanities and facilitated programs for Turnaround Arts, which used the arts to build successful schools. With former First Lady Michelle Obama, we presented the first-ever White House Talent Show.

The Educational Theatre Foundation (ETF), in collaboration with iTheatrics and Music Theatre International (MTI), created JumpStart Theatre (JST), a three-year scalable program designed to create sustainable theatre arts programs in underserved middle schools where

there were none. These programs are active in Cincinnati, St. Louis, San Diego, Atlanta, Frostburg, and Detroit.

iTheatrics celebrates musical theatre education programs through our Junior Theater Celebrations held in New York City; the Blumenthal Center for the Performing Arts in Charlotte, North Carolina; and Shea's Performing Arts Center in Buffalo, New York.

The Junior Theater Festivals® are the world's biggest and best festivals exclusively dedicated to musical theatre education. These festivals are held in Atlanta. Sacramento, the United Kingdom, Australia, and New Zealand.

iTheatrics works hard to make the world a better place, one musical at a time. We are committed to making sure every kid has the life-changing opportunity to make a musical. 



2024 Junior Theater Festival **Theatrics**



Timothy Allen McDonald

Founder and Executive Producer
Hi! I'm Tim, the Founder and
Executive Producer of Junior Theater
Festivals Worldwide. We serve over

15,000 musical theatre makers annually. I'm also the Founder and CEO of iTheatrics, where I've had the honor of adapting over 125 musicals ranging from *Xanadu JR*. to *Annie JR*. An estimated 36 million people attend one of these productions annually, which is three times the number of people who see a Broadway show each year. That's pretty cool.

In 1997, I moved to New York City from Northern California hoping to become a musical theatre librettist. Thanks to hard work and a little bit of luck, I've been able to write shows like Roald Dahl's *James and the Giant Peach* (Pasek and Paul), Roald Dahl's *Willy Wonka* (Leslie Bricusse and Anthony Newley), and *The Big One-Oh!* (Doug Besterman, Dean Pitchford), which was also reimagined as the world's first "Zoomsical" and one of the most produced musicals during the COVID pandemic.

I've also penned *Hans Christian Andersen* (Frank Loesser), which opened at Nashville Children's Theater February 20, 2020, and *Breathe*, written with Jodi Picoult and five songwriting teams (Rob Rokicki and Rebecca Murillo, Daniel Mertzlufft and Kate Leonard, Doug Besterman and Sharon Vaughn, Douglas Lyons and Ethan Pakchar, Marcy Heisler and Zina Goldrich), which has been inducted into the Library of Congress and is now available on Audible.

Since the fall of 2022, so many dreams have come true. Between the Lines opened Off-Broadway at the Tony Kiser Theatre. The Book Thief continued its West End journey with performances in Coventry and Leicester. I produced Jim Henson's Emmet Otter's Jug-Band Christmas at Chicago's Studebaker Theatre. Prior to JTF West, the debut reading of Austenland took place in NYC starring the incomparable Arielle Jacobs. Fortunately, people seem to like the shows, even the critics.

I should also mention I'm the co-author of *The iTheatrics Method: The Quintessential Guide to Creating Quality Musical Theatre Programs*, the world's first-ever educational musical theatre textbook (GIA Publications, Inc.), which is available everywhere books are sold. I'm dedicating this festival to our theatre teachers. Thank you for continuing to make the world a better place one musical at a time. Oh! Don't forget to follow me on Insta: TimMcDonaldNYC.

Susan's theatre career began in the third grade when she starred as the title character in *Miss Louisa and The Outlaws*. It wasn't until her sophomore year of high school

when her drama teacher made her the stage manager of the spring musical that she realized (for her) backstage is where the theatre magic really happens. Susan is an Equity Stage Manager with a BFA in Theatre Design and Production from the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music. Her involvement with Broadway Junior® started in 2001 when she served as Production Stage Manager for the pilot of Les Misérables School Edition. Susan has been a part of iTheatrics from day one (although how many summers that includes is the topic of some debate), where she is the Senior Managing Editor, overseeing the publication process for all materials released by iTheatrics, from adapted titles to study guides and educational materials currently circulating in classrooms worldwide. She is married to a ridiculous man who thinks she's hysterically funny and is the mom of two school-aged gingers, Beckett and Gus.

Associate Producer (Administration)
Lindsay (she/her) was part of the first
generation of young people to experience the
transformative power of the arts through
Broadway Junior®. She made her theatrical

debut as a seven-year-old with no front teeth, playing the role of Molly in Annie. Subsequently, she played the role of Golde in *Fiddler on the Roof JR*. and then continued her work with Broadway Junior® as the Music Director of multiple pilot productions at North Shore Music Theatre. It was there she met Marty Johnson, which led her to join the iTheatrics team after receiving her BFA in drama from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts. 

Daniel Rudin is a composer, musical director, pianist, and orchestrator with a passion for bold musical storytelling. Moving fluently between musical vernaculars, he strives to create music that connects

people to a sense of wonder and to each other. At just 26 years old, Daniel made his Broadway conducting debut with the smash hit MJ: The Musical, having previously made his Broadway piano debut at 24 with the critically acclaimed Caroline, or Change. He is a trusted musical director for some of Broadway's most exciting rising stars, including Andrew Barth Feldman (Dear Evan Hansen), Samantha Williams (Caroline, or Change), and Brittney Mack (Six), and has played in galas, concerts and readings with Brian Stokes Mitchell, Tony Yazbeck, Sutton Foster, Jonathan Groff and many others. Daniel is the creator of Third Reprise, a genre-bending, community-bridging musical project that reimagines iconic show tunes in creative arrangements. He is also a musical director and facilitator with the Gaia Music Collective, whose viral content have built a vibrant scene of community music-making in NYC. As an orchestrator and producer, Daniel has been trusted to breathe new life into a variety of projects, including a big band arrangement for Ilana Glazer's Comedy Central Special Comedy On Earth (song by Mark Sonnenblick, featuring Larry Owens), string arrangements for the debut album of MALINDA (1.4 Million subscribers on YouTube). and full orchestrations for 3 original musicals and cast albums to date. In addition to these recorded projects, Daniel orchestrated an oratorio by Julian Hornik for The San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus and Alex Newell at Davies Hall. As a composer, Daniel has produced a wide range of works sporting impressive stylistic agility and depth, including a sweeping orchestral score for the feature film Cram (Austin Film Festival Winner), the musical May Day (developed in residency with the Signature Theater in Arlington), the evening-length jazz/classical fusion work Songs of the Nothing, commercial jingles for the hit toy LOL Surprise!, and dozens of instrumental concert works for orchestral and chamber ensembles. Daniel began his musical studies in piano, voice, and violin at age 6. Throughout middle and high school he composed and conducted works for his school orchestra and chamber choir. He went on to study composition at the Julliard Pre-College Division and Tanglewood. He completed his B.A. in music at Yale, where he received the Abraham Beekman Cox Award for Musical Composition as "the most promising and gifted composer in his class." Daniel's teachers and mentors have included Jeanine Tesori, Jason Michael Webb, Joseph Joubert, Scott Frankel, Michael Gilbertson, and Christopher Theofanidis.




