the JTF mainstage programs and many other iTheatrics projects.

Since 2006, iTheatrics has been bringing musical theatre to young people everywhere. In a typical year, over 36 million people sit in the audience of one of our adaptations - three times the number of people who see a Broadway show each year. iTheatrics is committed to creating quality musical theatre programs for young people through our partnership with the Shubert Foundation/MTI Broadway Junior Middle School Musical Theater Program, which has built hundreds of musical theater programs in New York City schools. We partnered with the President's Committee on the Arts and Humanities and facilitated programs for Turnaround Arts, which used the arts to build successful schools. With former First Lady Michelle Obama, we presented the first-ever White House Talent Show.

The Educational Theatre Foundation (ETF), in collaboration with iTheatrics and Music Theatre International (MTI), created JumpStart Theatre (JST), a three-year scalable program designed to create sustainable theatre arts programs in underserved middle schools where there were none. These programs

are active in Cincinnati, St. Louis, San Diego, Atlanta, Frostburg, and Detroit.

iTheatrics celebrates musical theatre education programs through our Junior Theater Celebrations held in New York City; the Blumenthal Center for the Performing Arts in Charlotte, North Carolina; and Shea's Performing Arts Center in Buffalo, New York.

The Junior Theater Festivals® are the world's biggest and best festivals exclusively dedicated to musical theatre education. These festivals are held in Atlanta, Sacramento, the United Kingdom, Australia, and New Zealand.

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



THOMAS SCHUMACHER

Chief Creative Officer, Disney Theatrical Group

Since 1988, Thomas Schumacher has worked with The Walt Disney Company, setting new standards of excellence in film, television and theatre. He currently develops new stage works for Disney Theatrical Group as Chief Creative Officer. The division's credits include Beauty and the Beast, King David, The Lion King, Der Glöckner von Notre Dame, Elton John and Tim Rice's Aida, Mary Poppins, On the Record, Tarzan®, High School Musical, The Little Mermaid, Peter and the Starcatcher, Newsies, Aladdin, Freaky Friday, Shakespeare in Love, Frozen and Hercules.

As President of Walt Disney Feature Animation, he oversaw some 21 animated features, including *The Lion King, The Nightmare Before Christmas, Pocahontas, Mulan, Tarzan, Hercules* and *Lilo & Stitch*, and worked closely with Pixar on their first five films.

Schumacher previously served on the Board of Directors for Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts, as a mentor for the TDF Open Doors program, and as an adjunct professor at Columbia University. He was the Chair of The Broadway League from 2017 to 2020.

Timothy Allen McDonald

Founder and Executive Producer
Hi! I'm Tim, the Founder and
Executive Producer of Junior Theater
Festivals Worldwide. We serve over

20,000 musical theatre makers annually. I'm also the Founder and CEO of iTheatrics, where I've had the honor of adapting over 125 musicals ranging from *Annie JR*. to *Xanadu JR*. An estimated 36 million people attend one of these productions annually, which is three times the number of people who see a Broadway show each year. That's pretty cool.

In 1997, I moved to New York City from Northern California hoping to become a musical theatre librettist. Thanks to hard work and a little bit of luck I've been able to write shows like *Roald Dahl's James and the Giant Peach* (Pasek and Paul), *Roald Dahl's Willy Wonka* (Leslie Bricusse and Anthony Newley), and *The Big One-Oh!* (Doug Besterman, Dean Pitchford), which was also reimagined as the world's first "Zoomsical" and one of the most produced musicals during the COVID pandemic.

I've also penned *Hans Christian Andersen* (Frank Loesser), which opened at Nashville Children's Theater February 20, 2020, and *Breathe*, written with Jodi Picoult and five songwriting teams (Rob Rokicki and Rebecca Murillo, Daniel Mertzlufft and Kate Leonard, Doug Besterman and Sharon Vaughn, Douglas Lyons and Ethan Pakchar, Marcy Heisler and Zina Goldrich), which has been inducted into the Library of Congress and is now available on Audible.

The live capture of Between The Lines will soon debut on Amazon Prime, The Book Thief is preparing for its West End debut, Jim Henson's Emmet Otter's Jug-Band Christmas is fresh of its massively successful run at Chicago's Studebaker Theatre, and Austenland made it London debut starring the incomparable Lucie Jones (Elphaba Wicked, Jenna Waitress). I'm also working on a new Pasek and Paul musical (more on that at JTF 2026). I'm also the co-author of The iTheatrics Method: The Quintessential Guide to Creating Quality Musical Theatre Programs, (GIA Publications, Inc.), which is available on Amazon.

As a kid growing up in rural Northern California my life was saved by the arts. (Thanks, Mrs. Bowman!) Ensuring every young person, everywhere has access to quality arts programs in their schools and communities will forever be my first passion. Oh!
